Chapter 6 Be A Good Neighbour

Christ taught, "Love your neighbour as yourself." (Luke 10:27). It is a Samaritan who is the good neighbour in Christ's simily. The Jews treated Samaritans as inferior to them on those days. In such an era, Christ declared a certain Samaritan as good neighbour in his simily.



Don't try to be the owners of the narrow-minded thought "We and our religion". But try to have the broad-minded view" We and our religions". If the aforesaid idea dominates in our mind, irrespective of the religion, we can love Christ(Prajapathi) who is the owner of all sheep-pen(religion). Continuing in our own religion and holding our own traditional customs and rituals and also by secret donations and offerings and charitable and merciful activities, not considering the rewards and without discrimination, we can worship and serve Him.

"For I was hungry, you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty, you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in." (Mathew 25:35)

It is evident from Mathew 25.35 that, on the Last day of Judgement, the blessings or punishment given by Christ is not based on religion, or the customs and manners of worship but it strongly depends on the merciful and charitable activities. The holy words also teach us that mere religious offerings and invocations will not be sufficient for salvation. Therefore anybody can worship and follow Christ through his/her charitable activities, without converting his/her religion.

When a new religion is formed by God in this world, it is necessary to convert some believers from the neighbouring religions, for the proper development of the new religion. But this conversion is unnecessary after the maturity of the new religion. This unnecessary conversion results in friction and clash between religions and also riots between the believers. Mathew 5:9 "Blessed are the peace makers. For they shall be called the children of God". These words of Christ is relevant today.

The priests who argue for conversion from other religions clear the path for riots, whatever be their religion. Those priests who think conversion unnecessary are really messengers of peace. It is understood that the Hindu clergymen are messengers of peace in this sense.
